Dear Parents:

Fires and related burns are the third leading cause of unintentional injuries to children. Each year, an average of 3,650 children age 14 or younger are injured or killed in residential fires. Forty percent of these casualties are under the age of 5. Children playing with fire are the leading cause of child fire deaths.

The good news is that if fire safety is taught to children early and often, the chances of them playing with fire is reduced and making safe choices increases. Scottsdale Fire Department provides safety education to students in classrooms, at events and in the "museum" at our headquarters. We use the book "No Dragons for Tea" by Jean E.

Pendziwol and Martine Goubault to help elementary students relate to the messages and remember the rules.

Please review the activities in this workbook with your child. It is important your family know the safety rules. Be sure to check your smoke alarms and practice a fire drill in your home. See pages 10-12 to know what to do.

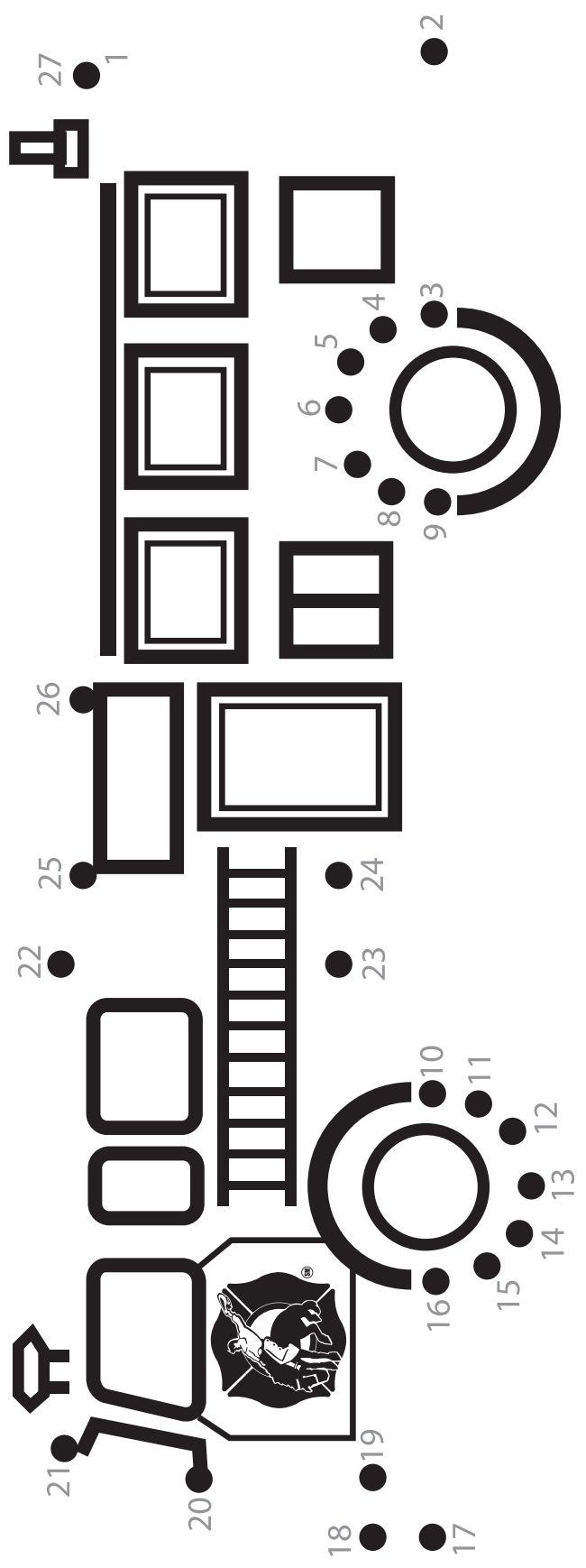

Smoke alarms can tell if smoke comes into a room. They make a loud beeping noise.

If you hear a smoke alarm, you need to get out **FAST!**

Smoke alarms have batteries. You need to test your smoke alarms once a month.

Put in new batteries once a year. Smoke alarms are on the ceiling or high on a wall.

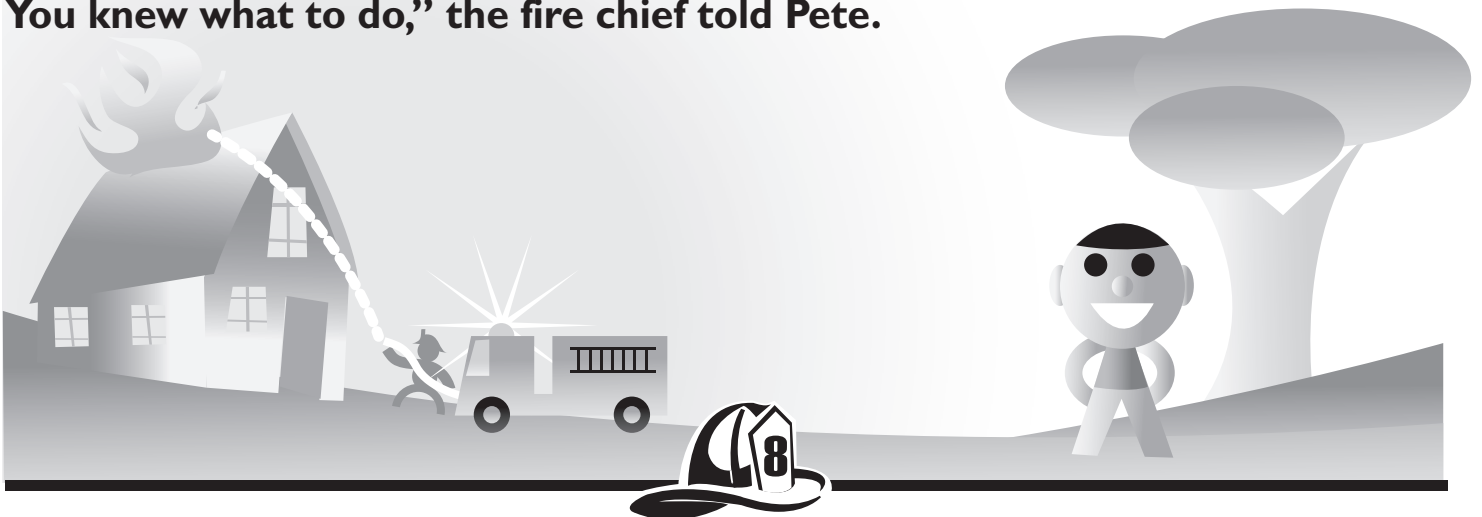

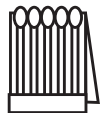

FIRE SAFETY

RULES



NEVER play with matches or lighters.



KNOW what a smoke alarm sounds like.

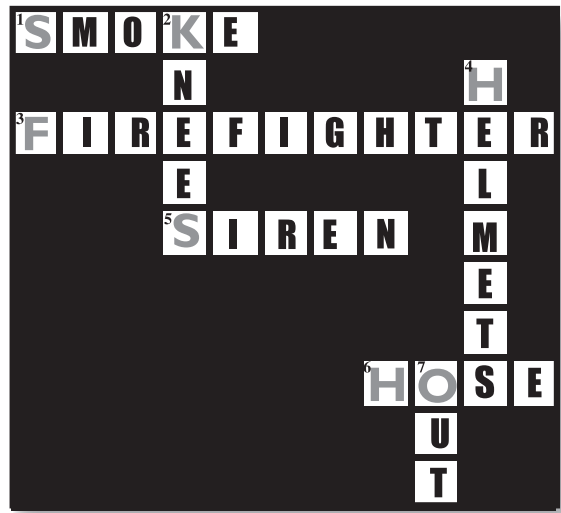
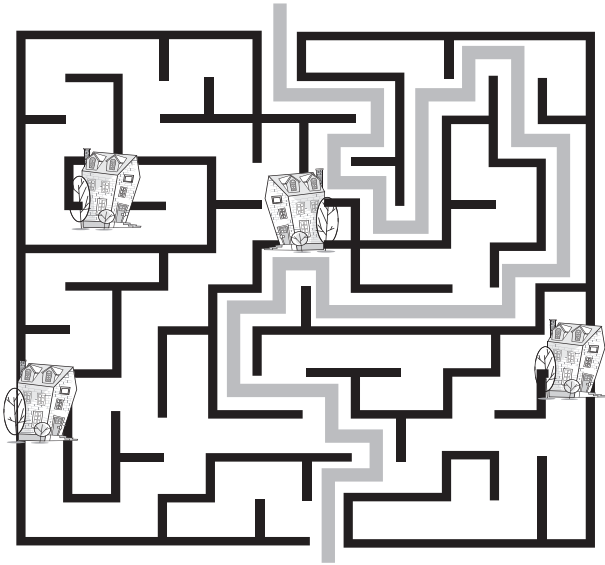
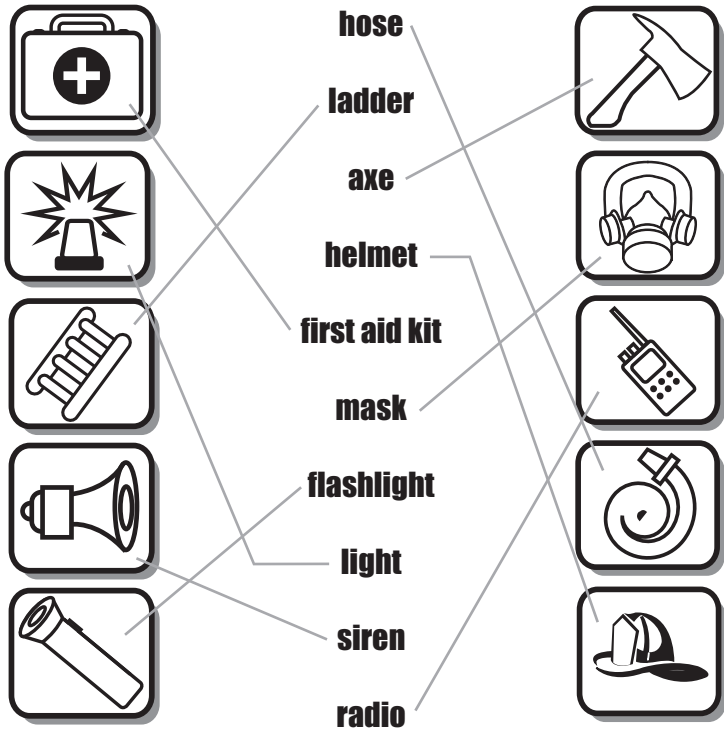


SLEEP with your door closed.

IF THE SMOKE ALARM GOES OFF

- **Crawl** under the smoke on your hands and knees.
- **Touch** your door with the back of your hand. If the door is cool, open it.
- **Stay low** and go if it is safe.
- **Make noise** to wake everyone.
- **Go outside** to the meeting place.
- **If the door is hot, don't open it.** Look for another way out or wait for the firefighters.
- **NEVER** hide from a firefighter.
- **NEVER** hide in a fire.
- **KNOW** how to call 911.
- **STOP • DROP • ROLL** if fire gets on you.
